
During the Keys to Degrees retreat we will have a series of speakers, tour the Keys to Degrees program at Endicott College, and share information with young parents about the college process.

#### **AAUW Gives Input to White House Committee on STEM Education**

AAUW advised the Committee on STEM Education on its <u>five-year strategic plan</u>. Federal agency leaders heard AAUW's input on how Title IX enforcement can help improve science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education and ensure gender equity in STEM. AAUW's <u>research</u> continues to drive national conversation on the topic.

#### White House Issues Report on Campus Sexual Assault

<u>Several AAUW priorities</u> were included in the Obama administration's April <u>report</u> on campus sexual assault. The administration created a <u>website</u> to compile resources and enforcement tools, and the report required the U.S. Department of Education to develop a list of Title IX coordinators, issued <u>guidance</u> to answer schools' questions about Title IX, and encouraged increased use of student surveys. <u>Share AAUW's takeaways</u> from the report, and watch for programming opportunities this fall.
