At ACS CAN, she works to develop advocacy strategies to improve the lives of cancer patients on issues related to Medicare, quality of care, and private health insurance.

Prior to working at the American Cancer Society, Holly worked with the Congressional Research Service (CRS) providing technical and legislative assistance to House and Senate committees and members of Congress on the Medi-

## **National Conference for College Leaders**

If your weren't able to attend the March meeting, then you haven't learned about the college student we are funding to attend the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders at the University of Maryland.

Jennifer Castano is a junior at UMass-Lowell majoring in Criminal Justice. She was born in the U.S. but spent her childhood in Columbia. I quote from her application. "...My life is a mixture of flavors and languages that surround me--English perpetually fused with the Colum-

bian influences I grew up with. ...I am blessed to have had the opportunity to grow up singing, eating, and practicing a combination of two languages, flavors and customs... Living in the United States, a country defined by multiculturalism and immigration, it is interesting to me how as human beings we are able to share a common goal and aspire to pursue something greater."

Jennifer is currently studying in Barcelona and will return in the middle of May. She is a member of the Honor Program and that faculty matched our grant of \$500 to help with transportation and other events not covered by the registration fee.

## THE AAUW MEMBER SERVICES DATABASE

We now have the option to renew our dues by check (our traditional method) or by credit card on the AAUW web site.

The latter option is only available to renewing members. New members will still submit a check.

The AAUW Member Services Database is the location to pay your AAUW dues on-line with a credit card. The following instructions describe the registration, log on, and dues payment processes:

Go to www.aauw.org/member\_center/
Type your member number in the Member
Number field and click Submit. Go to
Step 7.

If you do not know your member number, click **Member ID Lookup**.

Type your first name, last name, state, and zip code and click **Submit**.

Your member number will display. Click **Enter Member Center**.

After a pause, the **AAUW Member Login** screen re-displays. Click **Submit**.

Click **Member Services Database (MSD)** on the left side of the page.

Type your password and click **Log in**. **Go to Step** 12.

If you currently do not have a password, click **register here** to perform a one-time registration to set up a password.

Type your first name, last name, state, zip code, last four digits of home phone number and click **Register**.

Follow the prompts to complete your registration. Once your login is complete, a welcome screen will display.

Click **Personal Membership MPP** on the left side of the page.

Complete your credit card information and click **Submit**.

Your dues are paid!


