## **PUBLIC POLICY** Five Takeaways from Election 2016

#### November 17, 2016

The seemingly never-ending 2016 election is finally over, and it was one for the record books. It was a year fraught with controversial candidates, positions, statements, and tweets — one that saw an <u>uptick in voter</u> <u>interest and engagement</u> but then a <u>major decline in voter turnout</u>. It was an election that saw <u>increased levels of</u> <u>anxiety among voters</u> as well as <u>incidents of bullying in schools</u>.

One important takeaway is that candidates did speak to issues affecting women and families.
