# **New Data on Human Trafficking Paints a Disturbing Picture** January 11, 2017

"Last month the UN Office on Drugs and Crime released the 2016 <u>Global Report on Trafficking in Persons</u>, focusing on data collection for the 2012–14 time period and drawn from the patterns and trends of trafficking in persons from official national criminal justice sources. The *Global Report* is currently the only international source of information on victims of trafficking in persons, detailed by age, sex, and form of exploitation in the 136 countries surveyed in the report."...

"Despite the inclusion of anti-trafficking and antiviolence sustainable development goals in the UN General Assembly Sustainable Development Agenda, the <u>report</u> outlines new and troubling developments. The data show that the unprecedented and massive movement of refugees and migrants has intensified since 2014, and that this shift involves numbers of vulnerable women, men, and children who can be easily exploited by smugglers and traffickers."
