We know we have a pay gap between men and women in the US. [AAUW is currently supporting yet another introduction of the Paycheck Fairness Act – an attempt to close the loopholes in the Equal Pay Act of 1963!] Perhaps at least part of the reason for the pay inequity could be that we have a confidence gap, too.

In their 2014 book, The Confidence Gap, journalists Katty Kay (BBC) and Claire Shipman (ABC) maintain that women are less self-assured than men, and, to succeed, confidence matters as much as competence. Both women have reported on American politics for many years, and they have been surprised by the number of highly successful women they've interviewed who have told them they suffer from self-doubt.

We'll discuss the book's findings, our survey results, AAUW research and some opposing points of view to inform our opinions on why women earn less and are under-represented across and at the top of many professions and what we can do about it.

We'll present all the information we'll need for the discussion on April 14, but it would be interesting if many of us take the quiz in advance so we can consider our personal results in the context of our wider discussion on women's confidence.
