Please join us on Tuesday, April 9<sup>th,</sup> in the Whiton Room of the Hingham Public Library, 68 Leavitt St (off Rt. 128) for what promises to be a wonderful presentation on equal pay negotiation. Our speaker will be Katie Donovan. Katie is a salary negotiation teacher, coach, blogger and speaker on equal pay and women's salary negotiations. Her client successes include increases in income from \$2,000 to \$20,000 and even double the current income. Her first mobile application <u>Earn More Girl</u> for iPhone and iPads calculates women's personal pay gaps and their true target salary.

Ms. Donovan's speaking and teaching experience includes, Harvard Business School Women's Association, Mom Corps, Holy Cross Women in Business Conference, Business and Professional Women (BPW), the Boston Chapter of Women in Construction and the Cambridge Center for Adult Education. She has contributed to Forbes.com I Did Not Know to Ask for Salary Negotiation Help and HuffPost Live. She also has been quoted and covered in articles on theglasshammer.com, The New "Getting Ahead": What It Takes to Succeed in 2012, by Robin Madell, Forbes.com, American

When not working on issues about equal pay and salary negotiation, she can be found launching her product <u>Tote-a-Tree</u>, enjoying Boston and Cape Cod with friends and family, and trying to learn to love running!
