BRANCH MEETING "The Stories Objects Tell: Discovering the Adams family through Museum Objects of Adams National Historical Park" with Kelly Cobble

The next South Shore Area Branch meeting will be on Tuesday, March 11th at 7:00 PM. at the Tufts Public Library, Jones Room, 46 Broad Street, Weymouth. Our guest presenter is Kelly Cobble, Curator for the National Park Service at Adams National Historic Park in Quincy. She has directed the Cultural Resource Department for sixteen years. Kelly grew up in Quincy, graduated from ENC in 1985 with an English major and teaching certificate. Her Quincy roots have served her well as the place where the threads of her various yet complementary interests in nature and the outdoors, art, and history meet. She began her Park Service

career giving tours at the Adams Site and began her research of the Adams's letters; connecting references in them to events and objects associated with the Adams houses.

Kelly's position as a Curator has many aspects, including studying, researching, and caring for artifacts that belonged to four generations of the Adams Family; identifying avenues of funding; working with other researchers and conservators; as well as presenting programs and special tours of the cultural resources at the park. The Adamses were preservationists and she feels indebted to them for saving history through their letters, art, objects, buildings and land.

Come to hear the stories of the objects at the Park and the women who lived at "Peace Field," the first Summer White House.
