PUBLIC POLICY

Today the right to vote for many is under attack.

The 19th Amendment, added to the U.S. Constitution in 1920, recognizes a woman's right to vote. In November, voters in nearly half the country are expected to face new voting restrictions at the polls that weren't there during the last midterm election four years ago. The exact number of voters who will be impacted depends on the outcomes of pending court challenges, but one thing is clear: these voting restrictions will hurt women, minorities, young voters, and the elderly the most.

H.R. 3899/S. 1945 is a bipartisan amendment to the Voting Rights Act of 1965 which would require key states that have demonstrated a history of voting discrimination to obtain preclearance prior to any voting changes. We need to stand up to protect the right to vote for which the suffragists before us fought so hard: Urge your members of Congress to support H.R. 3899/S. 1945 today!
