I Am Worth More: Zoe Spencer on Fighting Racism and Sexism in Academia August 01, 2018 by Zoe Spencer, Ph.D., a professor of sociology at Virginia State University and an AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund plaintiff.



"I write this blog while standing at the intersection of race, gender, and class. In that order. It is cold here, but it is by no means lonely. I am black, I am a woman, and I am from Barry Farms projects in Washington, D.C. Like many black women, I

sacrificed and struggled to raise a son as a single mom, while working and pursuing my Ph.D.

I was blessed enough to land a job fulfilling my divine purpose as a professor of sociology — paying it forward to my students at a historically black university. I must admit that in addition to my commitment to teaching at an HBCU, I assumed I would be protected there. I was certain that I would be safe from the inequities that raged outside the walls of an HBCU. I was wrong." ... <u>Click here for more.</u>
