### **PUBLIC POLICY HIGHLIGHTS**

There are four bills of particular importance to us currently. The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) has just passed the US House of Representatives and has been sent to the Senate. AAUW will continue to pressure Congress to pass this so we can finally progress the amendment.

There are three bills in the Massachusetts legislature that we are watching:

- An Act providing affordable and accessible high quality early education and care to promote child development and well-being and support the economy in the Commonwealth
- An Act to end child marriage in Massachusetts
- An Act to guarantee debt-free public higher education

**An Act providing affordable and accessible high quality early education and care to promote child development and well-being and support the economy in the Commonwealth**

This bill (sponsored by Representative Ken Gordon of Bedford, Representative Adrian Madaro of Boston, Senator Jason Lewis of Winchester, and Senator Susan Moran of Plymouth) will provide universal, affordable early education. It will also provide funding for after-school programs for children until age 12, and there will be grants to train early educators.

**An Act to end child marriage in Massachusetts**

*An Act to end child marriage in Massachusetts* (House Docket 718 and Senate Docket 292, sponsored by Representative Kay Khan and Senator Harriette Chandler) would keep the marriage age at 18 and eliminate the dangerous loophole allowing marriage before 18 with parental “consent” and judicial approval.

**An Act to guarantee debt-free public higher education**

An Act to guarantee debt-free public higher education has been sponsored by Senator James Eldridge and Rep. Natalie Higgins.

## Election of AAUW- MA President April 17, 2021

When Cris Ajemian was asked to consider the position of President, she reached out to Katherine Honey. Together they agreed to serve as AAUW-MA Co-Presidents if elected at the AAUW-Massachusetts Annual Meeting on April 17, 2021.

Cris has been a member of the Taunton Area Branch since 1972 and has held several offices both in her branch and at the state level over the years. Currently, she is the branch president. Cris retired from Massasoit Community College where she taught Spanish, Portuguese and English as a Second Language. She is active in her community and is a member of BCCR (Bridgewater Communities for Civil Rights).

BCCR was formed in 2015 in response to verbal attacks on people in Bridgewater based on their appearance and has worked recently to increase diversity, equity and inclusion in Bridgewater's schools and town agencies. Along with Cris, other AAUW members involved include Beryl Domingo, past AAUW-MA President, Evelyn DeLutis, Gloria Moran, Karen Reed Messing, and Barbara Balboni, all members of the Taunton branch. Cris and her husband Ray have two children and two grandchildren.

Katherine has been an AAUW member since 1996 and has held several offices including President of the Attleboro Branch. She has collaborated with many AAUW members to organize and present at events to promote equity and education for girls and women including the Envision the Future Program for Girls at Bridgewater State University, AAUW-MA Conference at Bristol Community College and the AAUW National Conference in Rhode Island. Presently, as the SE MA STEM Network Coordinator, in response to issues relative to DEI (diversity, equity, inclusion) and the need to increase participation in STEM education and STEM careers, she is working with several AAUW members including Cris Ajemian to develop a virtual program comprised of three sessions that will provide resources to support STEM education and DEI initiatives. Katherine looks forward to working with all AAUW members who would like to share their STEM and/or DEI efforts at the virtual sessions as panelists or discussion facilitators or include their efforts on the STEM/DEI resource list that will be available to program attendees.
