An Act providing affordable and accessible highquality early education and care

Update and Request to Contact Legislators

You will remember that AAUW-MA is a member of the Common Start Coalition which is advocating for this legislation. Earlier this month, the House Ways and Means Committee released their budget proposal for fiscal year 2025, which begins in July. The House Ways and Means Committee and Chairman Aaron Michlewitz are supporting continued investments in early education and care in the state budget, including:

- making the C3 operational grant program for childcare providers permanent;
- increasing access to childcare financial assistance; and
- raising reimbursement rates for providers serving children who receive that assistance.

We hope to see those critical investments prioritized throughout the budget process! And, while the proposal includes several key pieces of the "Common Start Vision", we believe even more can be done this year to meet the needs of Massachusetts families struggling with the high cost of childcare.

To that end, Common Start is supporting Amendment #453 to increase funding for Head Start programs. They serve the lowest-income families and children, who Common Start has always prioritized in our vision, our legislation, and our budget advocacy.
