Healing Palestine One Life at a Time

Learn one family's story of helping a child from Palestine through HEAL Palestine. HEAL Palestine is a non-political nonprofit organization founded in January 2024, in response to the unimaginable devastation in Gaza, where thousands of lives were lost in a short period, impacting generations for decades to come. Through its core pillars – Health, Education, Aid, and Leadership – HEAL Palestine aims not only to meet the basic needs of Palestinian children, but to empower them to meet their full potential. Through this program, to date, 63 children have been evacuated from Gaza for surgeries, prosthetics, and rehabilitative care in the U.S.

At our meeting on Tuesday, November 11 at 7 pm via Zoom we will hear the amazing journey of one Palestinian child saved by the Gormans. Please join us as we welcome Miriam Gorman to tell her experience with saving Walid.

He has done amazing things with a group of young people in Honduras teaching them about composting using a system called Bokashi which is a process that converts food waste and similar organic matter into soil amendment which adds nutrients and improves soil textures. In addition they are growing gardens at their school, and learning about solar energy, water filtration and reforestation. Peter is also trying to find ways to get his message out to people here in the US. He has been using the Bokashi compost system with some of the boys in his neighborhood. We're so glad he shared it with us as we all learned a lot and now we will do what we can to share it with others. If you'd like to try Bokashi composting or support the work Peter is doing in Honduras you can contact me and I'll put you in touch with him.

Our upcoming meeting in November looks like another great meeting. We will hear from a couple in Brookline about how they helped a young boy and his mother from Palestine when the young boy was in need of medical care and came to live in Boston. Then in December we will gather at the Weathervane Restaurant in Weymouth for our annual holiday brunch on Sunday, December 7th at noon. Public Policy

The federal government may be shut down, but AAUW is still showing up!

- **At the Supreme Court:** AAUW showed up. Our CEO, Gloria L. Blackwell, spoke at the rally, and our members were there on the steps. While some of the justices' questions were disheartening, it was

- **More layoffs? Maybe not.** AAUW signed a joint statement with disability, civil-rights, and education partners opposing harmful layoffs that would have gutted the Office for Civil Rights (OCR), the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP), the Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA), and the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education (OESE). A judge temporarily blocked the administration from moving forward at most agencies. Read more:

- **Opposing the Higher-Ed “Compact”:** The administration's “Compact for Academic Excellence” ties funding to rollbacks of DEI and academic freedom. AAUW will issue our own statement, and we've joined a coalition letter urging presidents and trustees to reject the “administration's invitation to violate the law, abdicate your duty to your students and campus community, and betray academic freedom.” MIT and Brown University have both publicly rejected the Compact.

Holiday Social


Our Holiday Social this year will be held on Sunday, December 7th, at noon at the **Tavern at the Weathervane**,


Book Discussion
